# **ECONOMIC TRANSFORMATION AND JOB CREATION**

#### Introduction

- In order to transform the Zambian economy and create jobs and wealth for its people, Government shall continue to pursue efforts aimed at increasing both local and foreign investments, production, productivity, value addition and trade, as well as ensuring that citizens participate and benefit fully from economic activities.
- In this regard, Government has prioritised agriculture, mining, manufacturing and tourism, as key drivers to achieving economic transformation; while considering energy, transport, information and communication technology - as well as research and development as key enablers.

#### **AGRICULTURE**



Government has instituted a number of measures to address challenges in the sector including enhanced surveillance, extension services, promoting agriculture diversification, irrigation development, extension services and promoting







- Comprehensive Agriculture Support Programme, to transform the sector and improve sector-wide productivity.
- Zambia has met the phyto-sanitary requirements for the export of plant and plant products, such as avocado, passion fruit, nuts, peas, soya beans and fresh cut flowers to markets









#### MINING

- To turn around the mining sector, Government is creating a conducive environment for increased investment and participation of Zambians in the sector, while positioning the country to take advantage of emerging opportunities in mining value chains at local, regional and global level.
- The conducive and predictable policy environment has unlocked the landmark investment of US\$1.35 billion for the enterprise Nickel Project in Kalumbila district and expansion at Kansanshi mine in Solwezi district



Government has signed a cooperation agreement with the Government of the Democratic Republic of Congo to develop the electric motor vehicle battery value chain.



Artisanal and small-scale mining has been prioritised for reorganisation in an endeavour to increase the participation of



■ Government is also working to address all irregularities in this sub-sector in order to end illegal mining, and ensure that the country benefits from this rich endowment.



- Government is moving to establish market hubs for **manganese** to provide an easy market for artisanal and small-scale
- In an effort to provide a favourable environment for increased investment in mining and downstream activities, **Government** will review the Mineral Resources Development Policy.

#### **MANUFACTURING**



- Forum (PPDF) in a vigorous bid to strengthen partnerships with the private sector, and scale up efforts to create an enabling environment for industrialisation and trade, jobs and wealth creation for the Zambian people.
- In full recognition that small and medium business enterprise are key contributors to job and wealth creation, Governmen allocated resources to the Zambia Credit Guarantee Scheme
- Over 120 SMEs are being supported with guarantees to enabl them access financing from commercial banks, as well a supporting beneficiaries with business development services.
- More resources have been allocated to the Citizens Econom Empowerment Commission (CEEC) for enterprise developmen with K365 million worth of empowerment products targeted at citizens, MSME as well as cooperatives, while it has also set aside K83.9 million to operationalise industrial yards across the
- Under the Constituency Development Fund, allocations have also been made to empower micro, small and medium enterprises and cooperatives.
- Government, with the support of the World Bank, implementing the Zambia Agribusiness and Trade project assisting small and medium enterprises to grow through multi-faceted interventions.
- Government has continued to improve and modernise border infrastructure with Kolwezi, Sakania, Kambimba, Kipushi, Chalwe, Mwami, Chanida, and Nakonde earmarked for urgen

### TOURISM

Tourism has recorded favourable performance in 2022 as compared to 2021, with the number of international tourist arrivals increasing substantially from around 240,000 in the first half of 2021 to nearly 496,500 in the corresponding period



- This increase is attributed to a number of factors, including relaxation of COVID-19 travel restrictions, as well as reduced
- To reduce the cost associated with establishment and operations of tourism enterprises, Government shall introduce a single licensing system for the tourism sector.
- Government will also upgrade tourism sites, as well as infrastructure leading to sites such as the Kasaba Bay in Nsumbu National park in the northern circuit and the Liuwa



## **TRANSPORT**



- As at June 2022 Government had rehabilitated and maintained over 1,000km of rural roads in Central, Northern, Luapula and Eastern provinces. Works will commence in Muchinga, Southern, Western, North-Western and Copperbelt provinces. The target remains to rehabilitate and maintain 4,464km of
- To improve the operational efficiency of the railway sub-sector, Government is in the process of improving the operations of Tanzania - Zambia Railway Authority as well as improving the infrastructure of Zambia Railways.



■ The aviation sub-sector is showing signs of recovery, with general passenger movement recorded at just under 680,000 in the first six months of 2022, compared to just under 290,000 over the same period in 2021.

#### **ENERGY**

Electricity and petroleum products continue to be critical enablers for the industrial growth and transformation of Zambia's economy.



Government has increased electricity generation to 10.8 million megawatt hours during the first half of the year, from 9.9 million megawatt hours in the corresponding period in 2021, with the increase largely attributed to the rise in water levels and the commissioning of some of the generator units at Kafue Gorge Lower hydro-power station.



- Government aims to commission the remaining unit at the Kafue Gorge Lower hydro-power station by the end of 2022
- To facilitate the export of electricity to the East African region through the Eastern Africa Power Pool, Government will complete the remaining circuits for the Zambia-Tanzania-Kenya Interconnector.
- To grow and diversify Zambia's electricity supply base, Government will ensure that alternative sources of clean energy such as wind, geothermal and solar are fully exploited.

# INFORMATION AND COMMUNICATION TECHNOLOGY

Zambia needs to urgently invest in the digitisation of the economy by investing in internet connectivity which stands at 68%, digital infrastructure currently at 45%, digital skills presently at 40% and digital innovation at 35%.



- To support digital skills as well as digital innovation and entrepreneurship, Government is partnering with the private sector to establish innovation hubs.
- ICT skills development is also being promoted through initiatives such as the national skills development for youth employability and entrepreneurship across the country.
