## HUMAN DIGNITY, EQUITY, SOCIAL JUSTICE, EQUALITY AND NON-DISCRIMINATION

- In respecting the fundamental right to life, the death penalty has been abolished.
- To preserve the humane living conditions of correctional facilities, Government will provide 25,000 mattresses, 50,000 blankets and 12,000 bunk beds.



• 3,256 community projects under CDF have been approved for implementation in all constituencies.



• These include the construction and rehabilitation of public infrastructure, such as **clinics**, **classrooms and police posts**.







 A total of 11,422 vulnerable pupils in boarding secondary schools in 130 constituencies have accessed boarding bursaries under CDF.

- Futher,29,916 youths from vulnerable families in 145 constituencies have accessed skills development bursaries.
- The approval of CDF projects has been decentralised to the provincial administration and guidelines on procurement have also been streamlined.

 Government has allocated K750 million towards rural electrification programmes for 2023. In addition, Government has set aside K156 million from the CDF to expedite rural electrification.

- As at December 2022, a total of **56,341 connections were** made against the target of **39,992**.
- Toenhanceaccesstowaterandsanitation, the Government, in 2022, constructed 1,416 boreholes, equipped with hand pumps. During the same period, 1,226 boreholes were rehabilitated and 206 piped water schemes were set up across the country.

- In 2023 and beyond, CDF will prioritise the construction and rehabilitation of piped water and sanitation schemes for communities and public institutions, such as schools, health centres, markets and bus stations.
- The procurement of desks has been prioritised in order to reduce developmental inequalities.
- 2 million out of the targeted 3 million learners are on the school feeding programme across the country. A total of 5,128 schools are implementing the programme.
- Government is enhancing the protection of workers' rights and improving the work environment for increased productivity through intensified inspections.
- A number of empowerment programmes are being implemented, including market booster loans, youth skills training programmes and grants for income generating activities.

#### **GOOD GOVERNANCE AND INTEGRITY**

- Accelerated the pace of digital transformation and decentralization.
- Continued to strengthen the policy and legal environment as well as governance institutions.
- Re-organized the leadership and management of investigative wings and increased resources to support their operations.
- Removal of all forms of rigidity that stand in the way of progress in service delivery.
- Money laundering and terrorism financing are emerging crimes, present a risk to national security and development efforts. Government has developed the National Anti-Money Laundering and Countering Terrorism and Proliferation Financing Policy.
- Implementing digital transformation through access to electronic services on licensing and inspections.
- Pensions and social benefits are accessible electronically; tax payments online.
- Decentralization: Human resource management system in the public service has been decentralized at provincial and district levels.
- In 2022, the decentralized systems contributed to the efficient and transparent recruitment of more than 40,000 public service employees.

- Ward Development Committees (WDC) and Constituency Development Fund (CDF) committees are now operational country-wide.
- Local communities are now empowered to participate in local development and empowerment programmes through these governance structures.

### SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT

- Sustainable development is key to the prosperity of the nation and is therefore at the centre of all development interventions.
- Zambia has an obligation to ensure that development is carried out in a manner that guarantees future **generations** a better country to live in.
- Climate change and its associated threats continue to affect the sustainability of the country's development trajectory. e.g. floods recently experienced in some parts of the country have destroyed people's livelihoods
- Effects of deforestation on the climate and people's livelihoods has necessitated Government partners with the private sector to plant in excess of 2 million trees over the next five years across the country.
- Citizens are encouraged to take part in this exercise and contribute to the country's environmental protection effort.
- Government, in 2022, adopted the National Community-Based Natural Resource Management Policy. This policy provides a framework for promoting community participation and strengthening governance in the management of natural resources at community level.
